

# **Crayons on Fabric**

## **Supply List**

### **1. Design**

Choose a design that you would like to use. There are many sources you could use to locate a design that would work well with the crayons on fabric technique:

- › appliqué patterns
- › stencils
- › folk art painting books
- › colouring books
- › clip art
- › your own line drawings

If you cannot locate a suitable design to use, I have included the design for a “*Floral Bouquet*” sample.

### **2. Fat Quarter of Background Fabric**

You may use a solid, light-coloured fabric, such as muslin, or a lightly patterned or tone-on-tone fabric for the background, just remember that the crayons need to show up against it! Extra scraps of fabric are useful for testing out the crayon colours in advance.

### **3. Crayons**

The big box of 96 Crayola crayons will give you lots of choice for colour, accents and highlights.

### **4. Paper Towel**

Bring 4-6 sheets of paper towel for heat setting the crayon.

### **5. Preparation Before Class**

Pre-wash your background fabric and press in half both ways to find the centre. Mark your design onto the centre of the fabric using a mechanical pencil or fine-tip marker.

*NOTE: Sewing machines will not be required for the half-day workshop.*
