

# Sewflakes: Papercut Appliqué Quilts using Cutwork Appliqué

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## Supply List

### Designing Supplies

- 12" x 12" paper - at least 20 sheets
  - I use easel (flip chart) paper (24" x 35 ½") and cut it down to size
  - I will have packets of 20 sheets of 12" x 12" paper **available for purchase for \$2.00**
- pictures for inspiration, i.e. clip art, colouring books, templates, cookie cutters, etc.
- mechanical pencil
- eraser
- ruler - at least 18" long
- paper scissors - large and small
- exacto knife (optional)
- protractor



### Fabric

*NOTE: All fabrics should be pre-washed and colourfast. This block will need to be immersed in water to remove stabilizer.*

I recommend choosing two fabrics with high contrast and avoiding busy or large-scale prints. Not sure? Try viewing the two choices from a distance to see if they stand out clearly or blend into each other. Still not sure? Bring a few a choices and I will help you decide!

- Fat quarter of background fabric
- Fat quarter of foreground (appliqué) fabric

### Other Supplies

*\* I will have 12" squares of water-soluble stabilizer available for purchase at \$2.00/piece.*

- 12" x 12" clear, water-soluble stabilizer \*
- Water-soluble marker
- Ruler, at least 18" long
- Fine-pointed scissors for detailed cutting
  
- Cotton thread that matches appliqué fabric, for bobbin and outline stitching
- Machine embroidery thread (rayon or cotton sheen) that matches appliqué fabric, for satin stitching
- 8" or 10" embroidery hoop
  
- Sewing machine, with appliqué foot and free-motion darning foot
- 12-15 small safety pins
